ACCLAMATION

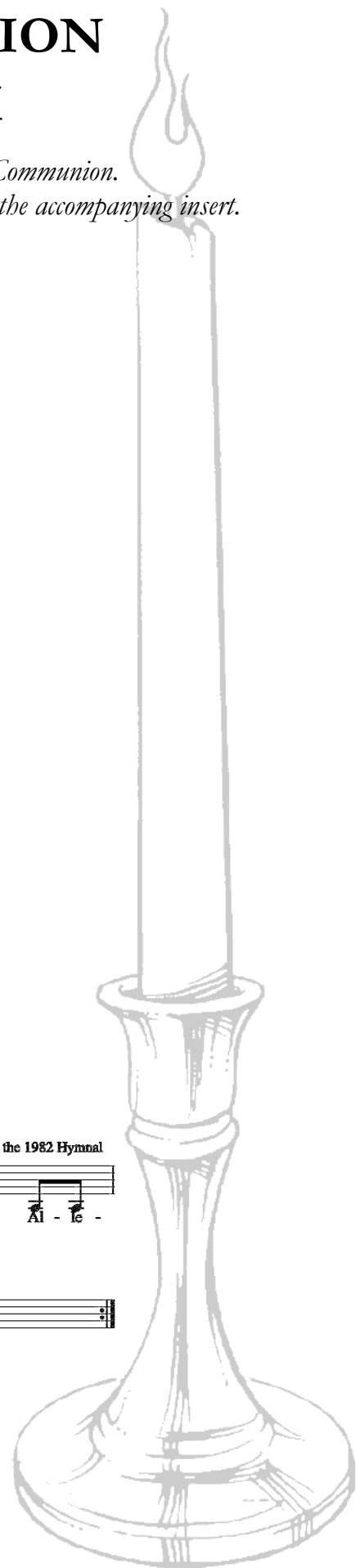
Celebrant: Alleluia. Christ is risen.

Celebrant Remembering the mighty acts of God who has delivered us from sin and death through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, let us offer our prayers for the church and the world.

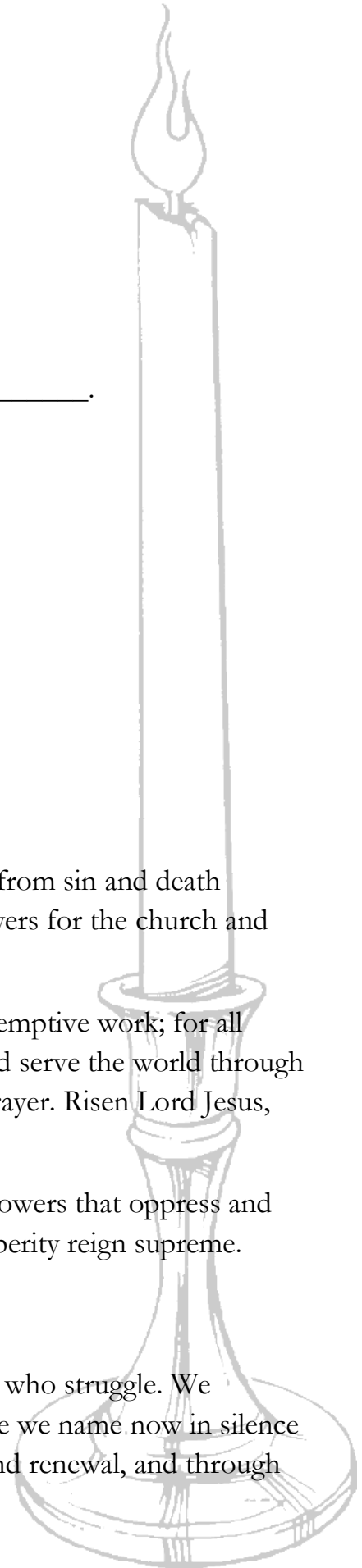

Celebrant Receive our prayers, Almighty God, and transform us through them, that we may have eyes to see and hearts to understand not only what you do on our behalf, but what you call us to do on yours, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

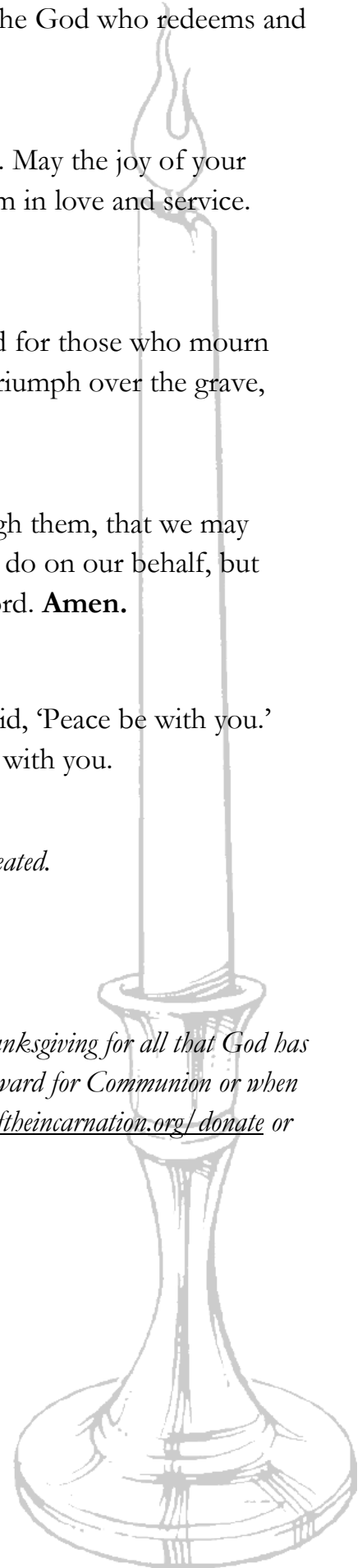
THE HOLY COMMUNION

you would not forget us.

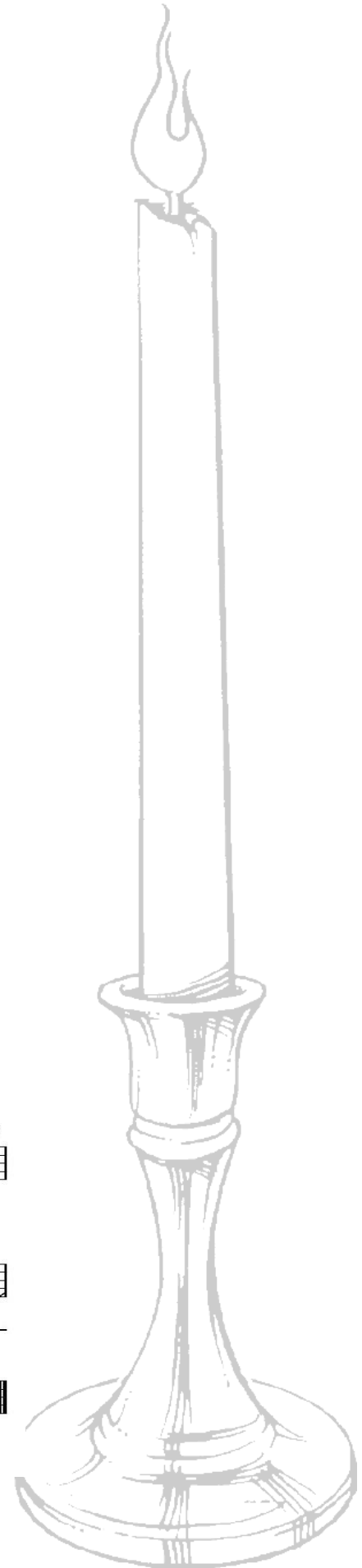
Time and again you called us

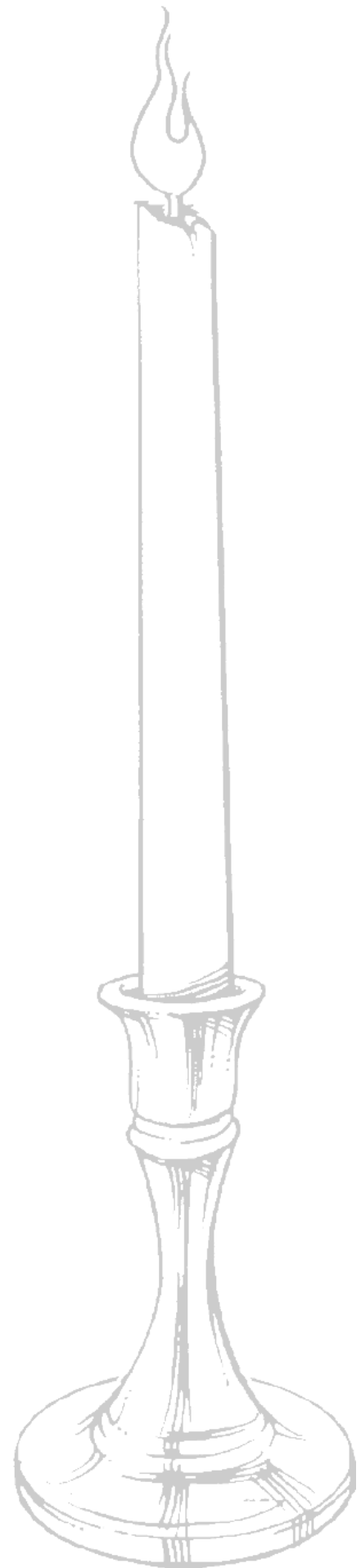


The people kneel or remain standing as the Celebrant continues.

Celebrant Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God.
To deliver us from the power of sin and death
and to reveal the riches of your grace,
you looked with favor upon Mary, your willing servant,
that she might conceive and bear a son,
Jesus the holy child of God.
Living among us, Jesus loved us.
He broke bread with outcasts and sinners,
healed the sick, and proclaimed good news to the poor.
He yearned to draw all the world to himself
yet we were heedless of his call to walk in love.
Then, the time came for him to complete upon the cross
the sacrifice of his life,
and to be glorified by you.

On the night before he died for us,
Jesus was at table with his friends.
He took bread, gave thanks to you,
broke it, and gave it to them, and said:
“Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you.
Do this for the remembrance of me.”
As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine.
Again, he gave thanks to you,

As our Savior has taught us, we now pray.

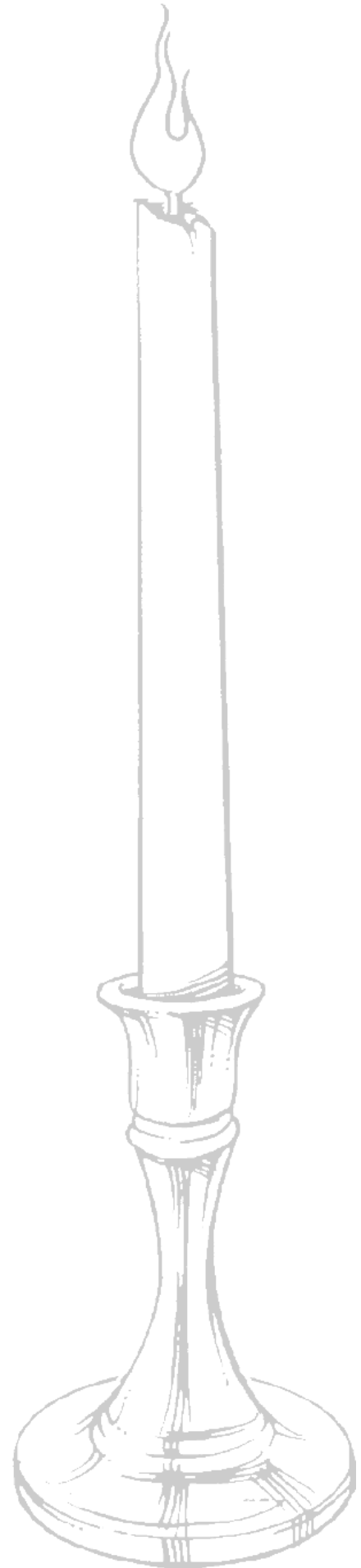
All: **Our Father, who art in heaven,

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Celebrant The gifts of God for the People of God.

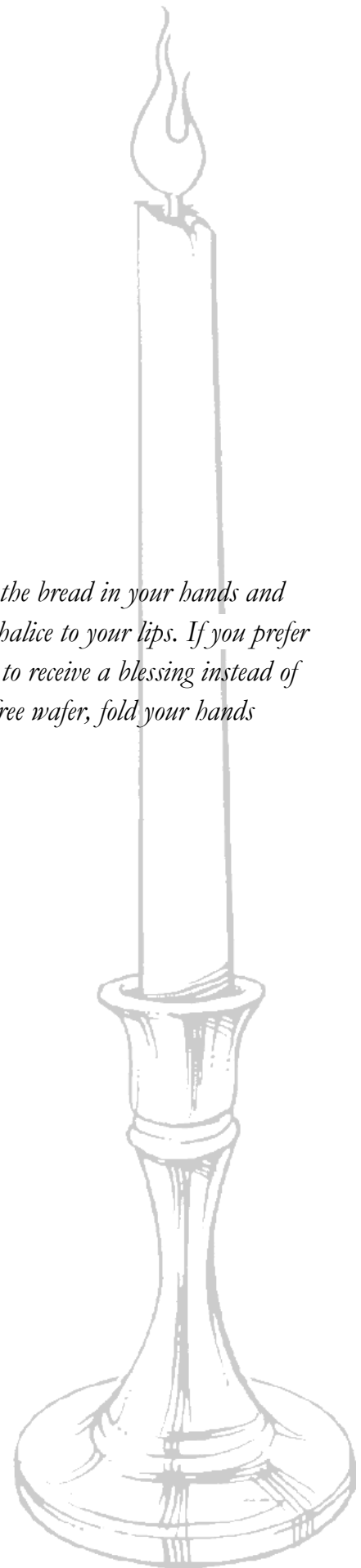
Please stand in a semi-circle around the altar to receive Communion. You may take the bread in your hands and then take a sip of wine from the chalice, guiding the chalice bearer's hand to bring the chalice to your lips. If you prefer not to receive the wine, simply return to your seat after receiving the bread. If you wish to receive a blessing instead of Communion, simply fold your arms across your chest. If you would like a gluten-free wafer, fold your hands downward.
