On the mind of the Rev. J. Gregory Morgan...

My fellow parishioners,

If we have not yet met, it is only that I am quite new to Incarnation. I've been worshipping here since I retired from my position as Priest-in-Charge at St. Alban's parish on Staten Island at the end of April. Since this meant that I was "unmoored" on Sunday mornings, I have been attending services at Incarnation where my husband, Thomas M. Reefer, is your parish administrator and organist/choirmaster. I have also taught a Bible study unit on the Book of Exodus before the 11:00 service and have officiated at one of the midweek Eucharists recently, so I am gradually getting to know the congregation.

I am writing to you this week to invite you to join me in a more concentrated form of Christian adult formation than you may have encountered before, a course developed for the laity at the Episcopal seminary in Sewanee TN at the University of the South. The course is called Education for Ministry, and we sent out an introductory article about it in a previous edition of the weekly electronic newsletter. I wanted to remind you of what EfM is, what an opportunity it represents, and also invite you to one of two available information sessions to learn more. This is a four-year course (you sign up for one year at a time) in scripture (both the Old and New Testaments, church history, theology, ethics and interfaith experiences). I have agreed to mentor the group at Incarnation which is already in existence; since participants graduate after four years, we always need to recruit new members for the class (each group includes from 6 to 12 students). This means that an individual EfM class can include students in any of the four years covered in the course and in some cases all four so that there is a lot of cross-fertilization each week (the course is offered over a 36-week period each year from fall through early summer). Thus, this update of our original announcement about EfM.

Let me explain that EfM played a very significant role in my formation as an adult Christian. In 2000-2001 I took Year One in Maine where we spent summers when I was working in Washington, and I finished the other three years at Grace & Holy Trinity Cathedral in Kansas City, MO in 2001-2004, after which I became an official mentor. Even though I grew up in the home of a Protestant minister and was immersed in church throughout my childhood and young adulthood, EfM was a real eye-opener for me because we sometimes need a lot of exposure before ideas can really take shape in our intellects. That's what happened with me as I explored the topics covered in this course. Ultimately, it actually led me to enter Holy Orders and become a priest. That is not the purpose of EfM, but it is sometimes the outcome for some participants because the course opens up vistas that even those with a long-standing relationship with the church can benefit from on many levels.

Since there is much more you would want to know before enrolling, Deacon Denise LaVetty and I are offering two formal information sessions for parishioners who would like to explore the opportunity in greater depth. See the announcement below for details. I hope you will join us to learn more about how you can deepen your own faith and begin to see scripture and the tradition of the church in a whole new light.
