And the life of the world.





REFLECTION ON SCRIPTURE



Leader We pray for our nation, for all the nations of the earth, and for all who govern and judge, that your light may lead their way to justice and truth. Lord, in your mercy,
People **hear our prayer.**

Leader We pray for those who hunger, those who thirst, those who cry out for freedom, those who live under the threat of terror, and those without a place to lay their head. Lord, in your mercy,
People **hear our prayer.**

Leader We pray for all who are tormented or tempted to despair. Help us to be beacons of your hope and vessels of your love. Lord, in your mercy,
People **hear our prayer.**

Leader We pray for those people whose names, faces, or needs are placed upon our hearts. We remember especially those on our parish prayer list and those we name now in silence or aloud.

The People may add their own names in silence or aloud.

People Lord, in your mercy,
hear our prayer.

Leader We pray for those who rest in Christ, who have entered into the land of eternal light and your abiding peace. Lord, in your mercy,
People **hear our prayer.**

Celebrant God of infinite goodness, throughout the ages you have persevered in claiming and reclaiming your people.

All **Renew for us your call to repentance, surround us with witnesses to aid us in our journey, and grant us grace to fashion our lives anew, through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.**


THE PEACE *All stand.*

People **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**


Celebrant It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

The people kneel or remain standing as the Celebrant continues.

Celebrant Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

The people kneel or remain standing as the Celebrant continues.

Celebrant On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:



All **Christ has died.**
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.

Celebrant We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.**


And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Celebrant The gifts of God for the People of God.

Please stand in a semi-circle around the altar to receive Communion. You may take the bread in your hands and then take a sip of wine from the chalice, guiding the chalice bearer's hand to bring the chalice to your lips. Or you may intinct (dip the wafer into the wine). If you wish to receive a blessing instead of Communion, simply fold your arms across your chest. If you would like a gluten-free wafer, fold your hands downward.


PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION
